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III. Summary of the exchange project 2006

Participants of this meeting came from 11 ED Relays from IT, HU, SLO and AT to Graz/Austria. The meeting started at 17th October in the afternoon with introduction, mutual exchange and a workshop finding best/worst practice examples.

The targets of our workshop in Graz can be summarized as follows:

- · Learning from and with one another
- Know how transfer
- · Mutual exchange of working experience
- To discuss the role of neighbouring languages for a better cultural understanding
- To discuss and elaborate possible projects for the future

After the group presentations and discussions we could summarize our findings and assigned those to positive and negative experiences (see attached photos of the flip chart papers). We elaborated a general thesis about our work and found out that the following factors are decisive for the success of the EDs in carrying out projects our events (see also attached photos):

- 1. Focus on target groups
- 2. Focus on special topics
- 3. Touch the people
- 4. Be active
- 5. Communicate knowledge and feelings

Next morning the host organisation, Land Steiermark, presented other existing bilateral and multilateral cooperations and projects within the involved "European Region Adria-Alpe-Pannonia", some participants presented their best practice examples in cross border co-operation. In the afternoon language experts (see list no. 11-17) joined the group to present the work of the "European Center for Modern Languages" of the European Council (www.emcl.at) which is situated in Graz and some projects concerning teaching/learning neighbouring languages (i.e. Italian, Slovenian, Croatian, Hungarian, Serbian and German language).

Last morning we had a short meeting at the Department for European Integration and External Relationship of the Land Steiermark (ED host organisation) and a further presentation at EMCL. At the final session the whole group discussed possible common projects for the future.

We tried to interlink our findings concerning the work of the EDs as such (findings of the first day) with the experience and knowledge of the language experts. The groups elaborated and presented many different ideas (see attached photos of the flip chart papers). This report just presents some ideas of this common work, for example:

- 1. **The Summer School in Baranya:** The findings and outcomes of this workshop should be presented and discussed also in Baranya. The participants of the workshop might be invited and a twinning workshop with representative pupils of the participating countries could be done.
- 2. A play to play with languages: Pupils or young students from different neighbouring countries come together and play a drama together using different languages. Such a project was already done with pupils from Slovenia and Austria in Graz and could be repeated with participants from the neighbouring countries. The play could be a sailing trip through Europe.
- 3. A youth summer camp in a cross-border national park: Pupils come together to play sports and to create a film together. The neighbouring languages are the working languages, i.e. the rules for sport activities are explained in different languages. Sport, nature and culture are experienced together in different languages.
- 4. **Earn and learn:** Young people go for some weeks to neighbouring countries and work there in the tourism industry. Schools are chosen which want to support this idea and are ready to prepare their students for this short-term visit abroad. The students study the necessary basic vocabulary needed for their stay. Abroad they do have a partner institution and/or a partner family. Working in a restaurant abroad can be an experience to better understand the neighbouring language.
- 5. We also discussed an **European Internet platform** for language exchange projects.


One project (youths from our countries making an interregional video documentation) initiated by ED Trieste has been fixed by 30 October 2006.




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
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III. Description of how each participant will follow-up the project at their relay/EDC in 2006 - 2007

1	ED Steiermark	We will continue the interregional co-operation within the European Region Adria-Alps-Pannonia and enforce common projects with ED Relays in this region. We will try to set up following projects – such as summer schools, tandem language learning etc. – together with our partners and to implement some of the best practice projects other relays presented in Graz. And of course: We hope to continue following projects in our region – either in or out of the Europe Direct Exchange Programme.
2	ED Trieste	It was specially important the mutual exchange of experiences concerning the European Day of Languages (26/09) and to find contacts with colleagues from Austria. We already found partners for a project within Youth in Action programme (application was sent in October). We also got some examples for publications, booklets and give aways, we will probably produce next year.
3	ED Györ	The Exchange Program let us to share the best practices of the participant ED Relays; we intend to continue this cooperation among each other. All the ideas that were elaborated by the different working group had taken into consideration the general thesis and could lead to the desired result, the improvement of the language knowledge. In the future we intend to look for ties in arrangement with the participants and our local partners to realize some of our ideas or elements of them.
4	ED Pecs	 Our intentions after the programme: to help individual citizens understand and communicate with their neighbours and to increase their own professional skills and mobility within its single market to work-out common future European projects for our different target groups/stakeholders based on the joint interest of the partners clear definition of relations with the Alps-Adriatic Working Community, with the Adria-Alpe-Pannonia Region and other EUROREGIO's a stable relationship and collaboration among the partners in the future a successfull participation in various EU programmes concerning the promotion of language competence.
5	ED Pest	We are looking forward to further co-operating with our partners and try to adapt the best practice examples we have seen (i.e. the Austrian Europaspiel or the EUGEM-Box from Steiermark). We are looking for fitting EU-programes for other project ideas we worked out together – for example the "Learning by Earning"-project.
6	ED Tatabanya	From 2007 we will offer information events and courses for schools and youth groups in German as a neighbouring language and in English – so participants get a better impression of different cultures in the common Europe.
7	ED Ravne	We are planning to continue with our cooperation in activities like this exchange programme. We will also try to enhance our cooperation with ED relays in our neighbouring countries and also with other ED relays. A.L.P. PECA is also

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9	ED	preparing for the next generation of EU programmes and we will try to include other ED relays in projects which might be of mutual interest.	
y	Bürgenland Nord	Please see Burgenland Süd.	
10	ED Burgenland Süd	We will force the co-operation with the cross-border nature parc Raab-Örseg-Goricko. If we could finance the summer-camp in the nature parc, we are able to organise it together with other relay from Hungary and Slovenia.	
11	ED Kärnten – Land	Next steps to go together: - to organise courses for English, Italian and Slovenian (for beginner and advanced learner) in our host organisation "Bildungshaus Schloss Krastowitz – Kammer für Land- und Forstwirtschaft Kärnten" – we have one education area called like "interkulturelle Bildung" (intercultural education) - work together with Interreg, we have a person in our relay to work for this and to work for EuropeDirect relay – to make common cause and projects with agricultural schools from Italy and Slovenia	
	ED Kärnten - Stadt	Together with other relays we will promote the different initiatives (summer schools, European Day of Languages etc.) and enforce the co-operation with our neighbours in Italy and Slovenia
