Scope of the workshop

Institute of Sustainable Techniques and Systems

Public involvement (participation) is a key element of two central strategies followed by modern European societies:

- First, participation of citizens in shaping their future is perceived as a prerequisite for sustainable development.
- Second, the call for public involvement is an expression of strengthening good governance and democracy towards an empowered civil society.

The importance of concrete public involvement in spatial planning processes is recognised at the international level. Decision makers in public administration and the private sector are increasingly involving citizens at early stages of infrastructure planning and resource use planning. Science provides basic and applied research, developing approaches and methods of public involvement.

Beyond national policies, basic EU documents and research programmes broach the issue of the relation between civil society, democracy and administration. In the context of the EU enlargement process and the growing together of European societies, it is of outstanding importance to develop common answers to the following questions:

- What do we consider as "citizens involvement"? What are goals of public involvement in spatial planning at the national/EU level – and what is the real situation?
- What can be learned via best practices? What is the concrete benefit of participation for society and administration? What are the obstacles and challenges?
- What is the role of science in supporting participatory processes? What kinds of research questions for future common projects should be raised and answered?
- How could we contribute to the building up of an international cooperation network on the subject "participation/public involvement in spatial planning processes"?

The workshop Public involvement in urban and regional planning processes (18–20 January 2007) will contribute to finding relevant answers to these questions during two days of intense exchange, consisting of a conference and an internal expert workshop. It will bring together a selected group of researchers and practitioners from South East Europe and Austria. These researchers are experts in the fields of applied research on urban planning, regional/spatial planning, traffic planning or evolution of society and democracy.
