


EU funding in Styria

■ 2007-2012: € 2.3 bn through EU programmes

- i.e. € 1,920 per Styrian
- thereof € 1.98 bn by EU and federal government

■ Funding focus


- Natural resources (EAFRD, EAGF): € 1.6 bn
- Sustainable growth (ERDF, FP7): € 678 m



Regional difference of funding focus


Graz (Stadt)

- 2007-12: € 332 m / € 1,250 p.c.
- Research and development (FP7)
- Regional competitiveness (ERDF)
- European Social Fund (ESF)
- Cultural funding (Culture 2007)



Liezen

- 2007-12: € 207 m / € 2,620 p.c.
- Agriculture (EAGF)
- Rural development (EAFRD)




Styria – a European region

- Styrian benefits of EU accession are above the Austrian average
- Since 1995 increase of employed persons in Styria by +19,6 % (2013)
 - above Austrian average (+15,3 %)
 - 2,600 employments p.a. through EU accession
- Styrian export orientation: export share 49 % (2013)
 - +10 percentage points since 1995
 - significantly above Austrian average of 40 % (+ 6 %-points)

Expected regional impacts of Croatia's EU accession

- High potential especially because of intensive trade relations between Styria and Croatia
- Styria shows highest share of external trade with Croatia of all Austrian provinces (in %, 2011)



10 years after EU enlargement – effects on Styria

- „New“ member states as a dynamic market for Styrian products
- 10 % of overall value of exported goods, € 1.9 bn (2012)
- Closer economic interactions lead to a higher international competitiveness (wholesale products)
- Demand of NMS-2004 maintains 10,000 employments (2011), especially in export-oriented sector
