# PACT FOR SKILLS



The Automotive Skills Alliance was created as a result of the Pact for Skills, the **first flagship action of the European Skills Agenda** launched by the European Commission in November 2020.

The Pact facilitates the launch of **skills partnerships** and aims to build large-scale multi-stakeholder skills partnerships addressing the needs of the 14 industrial ecosystems identified in the EU Industrial Strategy, being transport one of them. It also **supports** the EU Industrial Strategy and the goals of the Green Deal and the digital transformation.




### The Pact principles are:

# PACT FOR SKILLS LINK TO BLUEPRINT PROJECTS



- ASA builds upon the work carried out by strategic projects in the skills agenda for the ecosystem, and based on the Blueprint partnership collaborations, it will further broaden the outcomes of the key initiators such as - DRIVES (2018 - 2021), Blueprint project, which provides inputs to the future work of the partnership, and the ALBATTS (2019 - 2023) Blueprint project.
- DRIVES project provides Automotive Skills Agenda Strategy & Roadmap with clear indication of Key Actions for the sector, including the establishment of the Automotive Skills Alliance





- ASA will benefit from DRIVES and ALBATTS deliverables.
  - DRIVES work on Automotive Skills Intelligence Strategy and Roadmap including also Sectoral Analysis of Skills Demand and Offer, Analysis and Recommendations focused on Apprenticeship in Automotive Sector
  - DRIVES Framework initial version of EU-wide database of reference job roles and training courses provided across Europe and possibility of digital badges for skills awards
  - DRIVES Job Roles and DRIVES MOOCs to offer directly to companies and also to education and training providers to their courses
  - ALBATTS analysis of the skills intelligence in the Batteries for Electromobility sector.
  - ALBATTS further work to be carried out regarding to specific educational and training offer for the battery sector



# **STRUCTURE**







  - Improved methodology of education and training through identification of best practices coming from both WG 3 and WG4


# **WORKING TOGETHER**
